Brig. Gen. Matthew J. Lennox assumed duties as the Deputy Commanding General, Joint Force Headquarters-Cyber (Army) (JFHQ-C), U.S. Army Cyber Command (ARCYBER), in July 2024.

As Deputy Commanding General of JFHQ-C, he leads a team that provides cyberspace support to U.S. Central Command, U.S. Africa Command, and U.S. Northern Command.

Lennox earned a commission as a Field Artillery Officer in 1997. During his career he has served in key leadership positions from platoon leader to brigade commander. He has supported peacekeeping operations in Kosovo and participated in combat operations in Iraq.

Prior to assuming his ARCYBER position, Lennox served as Deputy Commander for Operations, Cyber National Mission Force at Fort Meade, Md.

His civilian education includes a bachelor's degree in Electronics Engineering Technology from Texas A&M University, a master's degree in Information Security Policy and Management from Carnegie Mellon University, and a master's degree in Strategic Studies from the Army War College.
